**1) WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER**

**MAYOR AND COUNCIL:** The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. and announced there was a quorum present.

A. Acknowledgement of Quorum

**Mayor Hart** acknowledged that there was a quorum present and indicated that Council Member Mehr was expected shortly.

There were no disclosures or conflicts of interest with items on this meeting's agenda. Council Member Mehr was not present at the time.

**2) REPORTS, PRESENTATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS**

A. \*Discuss and consider approval of Resolution No. 2023-02R, a Resolution of Ivins City, Utah, appointing alternate Administrative Law Judge

**Dale Coulam** indicated that Attorney Daren Barney with the law firm of Barney, McKenna & Olmsted has been serving, and will continue to serve, as the Ivins City Administrative Law Judge but with scheduling conflicts, it can be difficult to schedule timely hearings so Ivins City has asked Attorney Ron Hill, who is also with Barney, McKenna & Olmstead, if he would serve as an alternate Administrative Law Judge. This is an appointment by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Council. **Mayor Hart** invited Ron Hill to the podium. **Attorney Hill** stated that has been a practicing attorney for over 30 years in Canada and the U.S. and has acted as an Administrative Law Judge for other municipalities. **Dale Coulam** indicated that the types of things that the Administrative Law Judge will hear and consider, would be code enforcement (allegations of violations of code violations) and could act as the Administrative Appeal Authority from Administrative decisions. Legislative decisions are appealed directly to District Court. **Council Member Anderson** inquired if this appointment would be a volunteer position or paid via stipend or hourly? **Dale Coulam** clarified that it is an hourly discounted rate.
