This year's Second Annual Spanish Christmas program was put on by the 1st and 2nd grade immersion students. They sang and danced and had memorized their Spanish speaking parts. We are so proud of the hard work that the students and their teachers are doing. It's a wonderful experience to bring in a different culture for all of the school to experience.

We also held our traditional holiday sing-a-long. Every grade prepared a holiday song to perform. We put up a lighted Christmas tree in the gym, dimmed the lights and the students sat around the tree and sang. The students do such a good job cheering and supporting each other. It's fun to watch them really own the culture in our school. All of the grades of students support each other and it is really fun to watch.

In January, we held our White Ribbon Week which focuses on internet safety. Our theme is "I have the power." Students learn that they have the power to turn off hurtful images and get help from adults when they see something that makes them uncomfortable. We have mini-lessons in the classroom everyday as well as lunchroom activities that focus on internet safety. Every class made a superhero and named it. Bob Zentner asked if it was a state program, and it is not. A company has provided the content.

Summit Academy High School

Congratulations to Charlise Matsuda on being the first female wrestler from Summit Academy to ever be selected as a Utah All-Star. The Ross Brunson Utah All-Star Dual, which honors the best male and female wrestlers in the state of Utah, will be held at the UCCU Center on UVU campus on January 10th. 1,400 girls are wrestling in the state of Utah this year, and Charlise was selected as one of only 48 female wrestlers to participate in the All-Star Dual. We congratulate Charlise on this prestigious recognition and achievement.

45% of our students are on the 2nd term honor roll or high honor roll. Our students are beginning to receive their college acceptance letters. One student, Sarah Park, received an almost full ride scholarship to Boston College.

Our boys' basketball team attended a tournament in CA over the Christmas break, Showcase of Shoemaker Invitational" and won first place. Two students are receiving offers from La Verne University, whose coach met with them at the tournament and are being offered scholarships as well. Our boys' team is currently ranked #5 by Deseret News right now. This is the first time SAHS boys' basketball has

ever been ranked by Deseret News. At our game last week we invited the mayor and she did the announcements that week. The final count for teachers intent to return is 100%. Shout out to Tanner about a situation last week. He was able to report a report that a student had pulled up some suicide sites and they were able to get some help for her and her family right away.

Finance Report

Finance Update- We are a couple of weeks away from our team gathering for the budgets for next year. We meet and gather three different times to go over what needs to happen for next year. Brad's team and principles will gather data and build a budget for next year. A board member or two will be invited from the finance committee to some or all of those gatherings. It will give the board some insights about how things are done throughout the process. They are going to include some new ideas into their meetings this year. They have so many different sources of money that they need to discuss and talk about and will build a few more budget meetings. They have started to work on some things with their marketing team. They have decided to do some commercials that went out all through January. It shows when and where the commercial went out and what data we have from that. (commercial shown to group). The money for this was included in the current marketing budget. Kim received about 15 calls from this and they have enrolled 5 or 6 new students from this. This will be continued and Kim Welch is monitoring this. Bob Zentner asks about Alicia's numbers. He is looking at the numbers that were sent. There are 200 interested, but they have not been assigned to a campus yet. Enrollment seems to be staying very neutral from last year to next year. Jon Eborn was wondering about an equipment number. The 700 numbers are the capital projects. That is the price of the field redo.

#5201 Safe School Policy: Jon Eborn says that the policy states that if a student transfers a student to our school from another school with a Safe School issue that we would decide if we would take those students. Currently, we accept those students. For example: if a student arrives after dealing drugs in school at a different school. Jon Eborn feels that those students should not be accepted but feels like it should be discussed in an open meeting. The board packet was prepared before Bob's meeting with the advisory council. Chelsea Welch asks if we have a legal responsibility to accept those students, and there is not. Jon asks what surrounding schools are doing. The reason this was brought up was because one thing not in our policy originally was the position with a tobacco product in possession. Chelsea Welch

mentions that there are new red lines added. The intention of this today is to discuss it in an open board meeting. Jacque Shmidt removed a couple of items in section 7 and section 4. She felt like they were out of compliance and needed to be removed from the policy. The special ed policy should handle it correctly and this policy can redirect. Bob Zentner asks the question about a transfer mid-year. They would like the timeline clear. Joel and Jon would like to emphasize that we focus on the safety of the kids that are already enrolled in the school. Chelsea will meet in advance with Kim to make it approvable before the next meeting in February.

#5202 Search of Person and Property Property: Scott Petit will answer any questions.

#5203 Bullying, Cyber Bullying, Hazing and Retaliation: Scott Petit will answer questions. Bob Zentner is asking about the Athletic director doing training on this. It is referred to in the policy. He wants to make sure that this training is a top priority. Jon Eborn says that this is easy to envision for grades 9-12 and he would like to talk about situations happening in ages 5-12. We take this very seriously. Ms. Brantley says that there is a lot of difference between what is being mean and what is being a bully. They have to look carefully about what is being mean vs Bullying. How do you apply these terms to elementary kids versus high school kids? We want our parents to know that we take this seriously. They have to determine which one it is and the age and take all of it into consideration. They will use the policy to determine this. Jon Eborn brings up the discipline policy already in existence and if we address the actions that we would take that are not handled in this policy so that it is consistent across the board. Jon would like a baseline for that. Then we are accountable to the student body and to parents. He would like some clarification about what is done and a clear consequence that is not as severe as is in this policy. Ms. Welch is asking if a draft of the discipline policy be sent to Jon so that he can add his input since they are working on it already. The administration is working on a flowchart to show consistency. Jon asks if there is any place in the policy that allows a child that is having a situation to stay in place and have everyone else to leave the area. Lisa Cutler says that it is very rare for that to happen. Does it need to be in policy? It is currently best practice. We know that the administration is working on this and we want to make sure that parents and students know what will happen in certain situations. Transparency is important.
