1. **Call to Order** - Mayor Larson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm

5. Recognition of Greg Smith for his 40 years of service in the Genola Fire Department. – Chief William McMullin shared some of his experiences in working with Greg Smith and the contributions

59 **6. Commission and Staff Reports**

60 a. **Police Report – Sargent Shaw** – 53 calls for the month of January 24 traffic stops with 13
61 citations issues and a total of 24 violations.
62 b. **Fire Chief Report- Chief William McMullin** – AFG grant has been submitted, the total requested
63 for the grant is \$750,000, with a 90/10 split in payment. He reported that currently they are
64 leaning to purchase a Rosenbauer engine as they are easier to find parts for at a local auto parts
65 shop. Marcee Nelson has completed the basic EMT program and has passed her test. The
66 dispatch fees will be going up 8% and he expects to have those exact numbers for the next
67 meeting and to be planned for the next fiscal year.
68 c. **Planning Commission Chairman – Chairman John Rosenberger** – He went through the
69 agenda items from the last planning commission meeting. Mayor Larson brought up to the
70 Chairman that a subdivision wanted to know why they weren't allowed on an agenda for a
71 preliminary plat until they had all their approvals. Chairman Rosenberger said that they would
72 talk about that in commission meeting.

74 **PUBLIC FORUM** – There was no one signed up for the Public Forum.

76 **7. The Miss Genola Contestants will present their service projects that will be carried out if they
77 win. The Miss Genola pageant is to be held on March 18, 2023, at Goshen Elementary School.**

78 a. The Miss Genola contestants individually got up and told the council what service project they
79 would like to work towards if they would be crowned Miss Genola. Jana Manookin the assistant
80 director invited the council to participate and attend the Miss Genola pageant that is scheduled for
81 Saturday March 18th.

83 **8. Introduction of the new recreation director Kathleen Banfill and a discussion and possible
84 action on the need to raise the fee for field use by other cities and towns.**

85 a. Councilmember Grant Lundberg thanked Ms. Banfill for her being willing to take over the
86 recreation department, especially as he knows that this is all new to her. Ms. Banfill reported that
87 Eureka, Goshen, and Genola have all decided to play together for teams, with all signups
88 happening in Genola. Games will happen in all three cities, so the need to raise the field usage
89 fees won't be needed at this time but is probably something to consider for the future.
90 b. Ms. Banfill reported that she would like to see the town put some money in the future towards
91 putting lights on the fields. She stated that not having lights really puts the town in a spot where
92 make up games are hard to schedule because of the limited daylight.
93 c. She also reported that they will be required to enforce the rule of no dogs in the park. This is a
94 rule for the UBBA and if the town wants to stay apart of the program this is a requirement. She
95 stated that if dogs are on the premise and they are not a service dog then she will ask them
96 politely to leave and if that doesn't happen, she will simply just call the police.

98 **9. Discussion and possible action on the status of the tank and well project budget and costs.**

99 a. Mayor Larson reported that due to some complications with the tank and well including the
100 sluffing that happened with the drilling, the higher cost of construction and equipment including
101 the concrete heaters, the longer time frame, and the extra drilling/blasting needed due to higher
102 rock volume. It is expected to need around \$530,000.00. Mayor Larson presented the council
103 with a couple of different options for the town to pay the additional cost:
104 i. The Town is applying for a grant with the Division of Drinking Water to pay all the extra
105 expenses with this project. They are hoping to know within the month if the grant is an
106 option.
107 ii. Mayor stated that there could be a possibility of a split where some is covered by a grant
108 and the rest covered by the town.
109 iii. Whatever portion the town may be required to cover there are options that include:
110 1)The Town could increase the payout time frame from a 30-40 year loan. 2)An increase
111 in the payment amount with each year.

112 b. Mayor Larson stated that he expected to know more at next months meeting and be able to
113 present the council with more complete options.
114 c. The council discussed that they realize that most construction projects end up going over budget,
115 and the current economic conditions made this situation not surprising.
116

117 **10. Discussion and possible action on the election this year and if Genola will be doing rank
118 choice voting**

119 a. The council discussed how rank choice voting eliminates the need for a primary and the costs
120 that are associated with having a primary election.
121 b. Councilman Neil Brown made a motion to use rank choice voting again this year. Councilman
122 Stan Judd Second and the motion Passed all in favor.

142 a. **Mayor Marty Larson –**

143 i. Mayor reported that UDOT has put the revisions to the Hwy 141 and Hwy 6 intersection
144 and a climbing lane on Hwy 6 on their funding list and that it will hopefully be completed
145 by the end of 2024.
146 ii. The shooting range is expected to have an emergency shut down shortly and then it is
147 expected that the county will permanently shut it down. He knows that this is a polarizing
148 issue for some gun owners but feels that this is the best for the safety of the residents
149 that live close to the range. He recognizes the need for a shooting range just wants it in
150 a better spot maybe on the other side of the Payson dump.

151 b. **Councilmember Hale Robison –** He had nothing to report.

152 c. **Councilmember Grant Lundberg –** He reported that the Town Celebration committee is starting
153 to meet next week, and they are looking for lots of volunteers. He stated that they are still
154 working on finding someone for the Easter Egg Hunt. He knows that they are needing to find a
155 new Miss Genola Director. He is working on getting the fireworks set up, but he knows that they
156 will be more money this year.

157 d. **Councilmember Stan Judd –** He had nothing to report.

158 e. **Councilmember Neil Brown –** He reported that he went to a conference regarding internet
159 access. He reported that he feels that it is important for the local residents to report the speeds
160 that they are actually getting at their home, so that the Town can rebut the claims that companies
161 are already providing high speed internet here in Genola, in the newsletter that is coming out this
162 month will have a link to have our residents report what speed they are actually getting at their
163 own homes. He reported that he keeps trying to maintain contact with Dominion Energy and to
164 encourage them to bring natural gas to our community. Dominion Energy is expected in the next
165 couple of months to announce where their next rounds of funding will go to.
