

Lands originally designated by Congress at statehood are held in trust specifically to generate revenue for the support of 12 beneficiary institutions. Each beneficiary institution receives an annual distribution from their respective permanent fund. These funds provide an important source of revenue for many of Utah's most important public purposes.


101.8 M distributed to Utah K-12 schools at no cost to taxpayers, benefiting over 600,000 students in 2023-2024.

Health and Human Services

Three trust beneficiary endowments provide financial support for health and human service institutions. Assisting with the treatment of disabilities and illnesses as well as mental and behavioral health treatment for all ages.

Miners Hospital

Established in 2004 to provide health care to disabled Utah miners. Served over 2,500 patients in the last 5 years. 1,704 miners are currently enrolled and receiving treatment.
