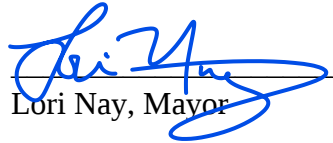
Led a discussion about the new park sign and would like to have it done before the 4th of July.
