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23 The minutes from the January 14, 2014 meetings were reviewed. Mr. Hatch made the motion to approve the  
24 minutes. Mr. Beck seconded. All were in favor.

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26 Cl. Child reported that Rod Andrew is on the agenda for tonight’s City Council Work Meeting to be approved to be  
27 on the Water Board.

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29 Mr. Barker gave a current report on the North Main Water Line Replacement Project.

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31 Mr. Stapley reviewed the 1500 W Sewer Project that is currently going in.

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33 Mr. Barker mentioned the Burt Springs/900 S Well Improvement Project. Mr. Stapley distributed the bid tabulation  
34 on that project. The project will be approved in City Council next week. Mr. Stapley briefly reviewed the project,  
35 explaining how the City will be able to pump out more water with the new pump.

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37 Mr. Stapley reported that snow pack is at 72%. Mr. Crandall read that state wide is 91% with the recent snowfall.  
38 Our area is probably not that high.

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40 Mr. Stapley talked about the Water Optimization Study that Hansen, Allen, and Luce, Inc. have been working on.  
41 The Hobble Creek Zone was draining into the Spring Creek Zone and we were losing a lot of water from one zone to  
42 another. They found the PRV settings on the Hobble Creek side were too high and it constantly fed into the lower  
43 Spring Creek Zone. With the changes we’ve been able to take a huge demand off the 400 S well. The system has  
44 been balanced with this change. Mr. Stapley also reviewed the upcoming Tank Overflow project that will start soon.

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46 1. Water Rate Structures - Mr. Barker was able to gather rates from surrounding cities. Mr. Hotchkiss would like to  
47 see that in a spreadsheet form. Mr. Barker distributed information for the board to review. Mr. Hatch was surprised  
48 that Orem City bases the average on 28,000 gallons per month. That seems really low. He thinks Springville’s  
49 average is around 60,000 gallons per month.

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51 There was discussion on how cities have different percentages transferred to their general funds. Provo may charge  
52 less for water because they have more people. Cl. Child stated that he thinks it’s good to compare to other cities, but  
53 sometimes it’s irrelevant because Springville City is completely different. Mr. Stapley explained how sinking funds  
54 are set up to keep up on maintenance.

1 2. Secondary Water – Mr. Stapley reviewed the upcoming project to install a 36” pressure irrigation line down 800  
2 and 900 South to the West Fields. The crossings on Main Street will need to be completed before UDOT comes in  
3 this Spring to resurface the road. Mr. Hotchkiss asked if anyone is looking at the financial implication analysis of  
4 how PI water will affect culinary water revenue. Mr. Stapley reviewed where the water will be coming from to fill  
5 that pipe.  
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7 3. Waste Water Issues – Mr. Andrew reviewed the recent meeting with Nestle concerning Odor Control at the Waste  
8 Water Treatment Plant. They have proposed a 3 year plan to work on different things that can be done to help with  
9 that. They are also looking at putting in dry scape to reduce how much water they are using out of Spring Creek to  
10 irrigate their lawn.

12 Mr. Hotchkiss will be out of town in March and April. He asked Mr. Beck to conduct the meetings. Mr. Crandall  
13 and Mr. Andrew will also be out of town in March. The board decided to cancel the March meeting.  
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15 Mr. Hatch moved to adjourn. Mr. Beck seconded.  
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17 *Adjourn* – This meeting adjourned at 7:28 a.m.  
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
