LBA NEW BUSINESS

a. LBA Fiscal Year 2024 Tentative Budget

Jordan Hales discussed the Local Building Authority and how it accounts for city buildings that are built with the building serving as collateral on the loan. Both the construction and the debt payments show up in this fund. The revenue to pay for these things comes from the city, with the city making a lease payment for the use of the building to the LBA, and then the LBA making the debt payment.

Jordan Hales explained that bond proceeds are used to construct the buildings, and interest earnings are generated on cash reserved for construction that hasn't been spent yet. The only project currently going on is the new SFCN building, which will be paid off using user fees, with no tax money being used. Finally, Perrins mentions the construction of a new special school at 657 West Center, with an estimated completion date in the spring of 2024.

Councilman Marshall wanted to know if the recreation center would be going into the LBA.

Jordan Hales stated no it would not because the market doesn't view the rec center as a utility, but rather as a luxury item, which would result in a higher interest rate if issued as a LBA debt. Additionally, there is plenty of headroom to pledge more debt on the sales tax, so it makes sense to use it as collateral for the rec center debt.

Councilman Marshall • made a **Motion** to approve the **LBA Fiscal Year 2024 Tentative Budget with a Public Hearing on June 6th, 2023, at 6 pm in the Council Chambers.**
